The Proclamation of the Word

The 1st Reading Exodus 17: 1 - 7 Read by Ian Coombe From the wilderness of Sin the whole congregation of the Israelites journeyed by stages, as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ² The people quarrelled with Moses, and said, 'Give us water to drink.' Moses said to them, 'Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?' 3 But the people thirsted there for water; and the people complained against Moses and said, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?' 4 So Moses cried out to the Lord, 'What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me'. ⁵ The Lord said to Moses, 'Go on ahead of the people, and take some of the elders of Israel with you; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. 6 I will be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Strike the rock, and water will come out of it, so that the people may drink.' Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. ⁷ He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarrelled and tested the Lord, saying, 'Is the Lord among us or not?'

Here what the Spirit is saying! **Thanks be to God.**

that your people may rejoice in you?

⁷ Show us your mercy, O Lord, * and grant us your salvation.

⁸ I will listen to what you, Lord God, are saying, * for you are speaking peace to your faithful people and to those who turn their hearts to you.

- ⁹ Truly, your salvation is very near to those who fear you, * that your glory may dwell in our land.
- ¹⁰ Mercy and truth have met together; *

righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

¹¹ Truth shall spring up from the earth, * and righteousness shall look down from heaven.

¹² Lord, you will indeed grant prosperity, * and our land will yield its increase.

¹³ Righteousness shall go before you, * and peace shall be a pathway for your feet.

The 2nd Reading 2 Corinthians 5: 18 -20 Read by Norma Riley

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us.

²⁰So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

Touch our eyes, that we may see the sacredness in all creation.

Hear us, O Christ.

Touch our ears, that we may hear from every mouths of every peoples the hunger for hope and stories of refreshment.

Hear us, O Christ

Touch our lips, that we may speak of the beauty of every tongue and dialect proclaiming the wonderful works of God. **Hear us, O Christ.**

Touch our hearts, that we may discern your mission in which you call us to be immersed, particularly in partnership with the First Peoples of this land. **Hear us, O Christ.**
